Every three to four years, another version is released. The process is involved and includes understanding the changing conditions for the control system integration industry, reviewing each section for its content and relevance, obtaining feedback from various stakeholders, reviewing audit and legal requirements, and performing pilot audits.

The Best Practices Committee is the team responsible for updating and revising this manual to meet the constantly evolving needs of the control system industry.
